B. Presentation of Quarterly Investment report ending on June 30, 2025.

Executive Director, Raudel Garza, gave a brief presentation of the board on the quarterly investment report. The report ending 06/30/2025 showed a beginning balance of \$9,494,022.27, with earnings of \$102,207.10 and an ending balance of \$9,596,229.37. No action was needed as it was only a presentation.

C. Consider and take action on approval of Contribution for UTRGV Athletic Department.

Associate Athletic Director for Revenue Generation, Seth Jones, spoke about the changes to the upcoming UTRGV Athletics Marketing package. The UTRGV request remained at \$35,000, providing 14 season tickets with the option to request six additional tickets at no cost, depending on weekly availability from UTRGV Athletics staff. The 14 season tickets will stay in the same location year-round, grouped in blocks of four and six, while the additional tickets, if used, will vary in location based on availability. Other items in this package remained unchanged.

The Edinburg Arts Foundation is requesting \$25,000 for the Presenting Sponsorship of the South Texas International Film Festival (STXIFF) 2025, scheduled for September 2025. Funding will be used to:

- Underwrite festival programming, including screenings, panels, and networking events.
- Support Creative Workforce Workshops for local film professionals, providing training to qualify for hire on productions filming in Edinburg.
- Cover costs for venue rentals, technical production, marketing, and hospitality for visiting filmmakers and industry professionals.

This investment directly enhances the festival's quality, reach, and economic impact for the City of Edinburg.

STXIFF is a proven economic driver for Edinburg:

- 2,700 attendees in 2024, with over 10% traveling from outside Edinburg and staying an average of 2–3 nights.
 - Combined average spending per attendee exceeded \$50, generating tens of thousands of dollars in direct economic activity for local hotels, restaurants, retail shops, and service providers.
 - The festival attracts filmmakers and industry professionals from across the U.S., contributing to hospitality, transportation, and media coverage that elevates Edinburg's profile as a cultural destination.
 - Through the City's Film Friendly Program (launched in 2022), Edinburg has hosted 22 productions, with STXIFF serving as a hub for workforce development to support these productions—driving both consumer spending and job creation.

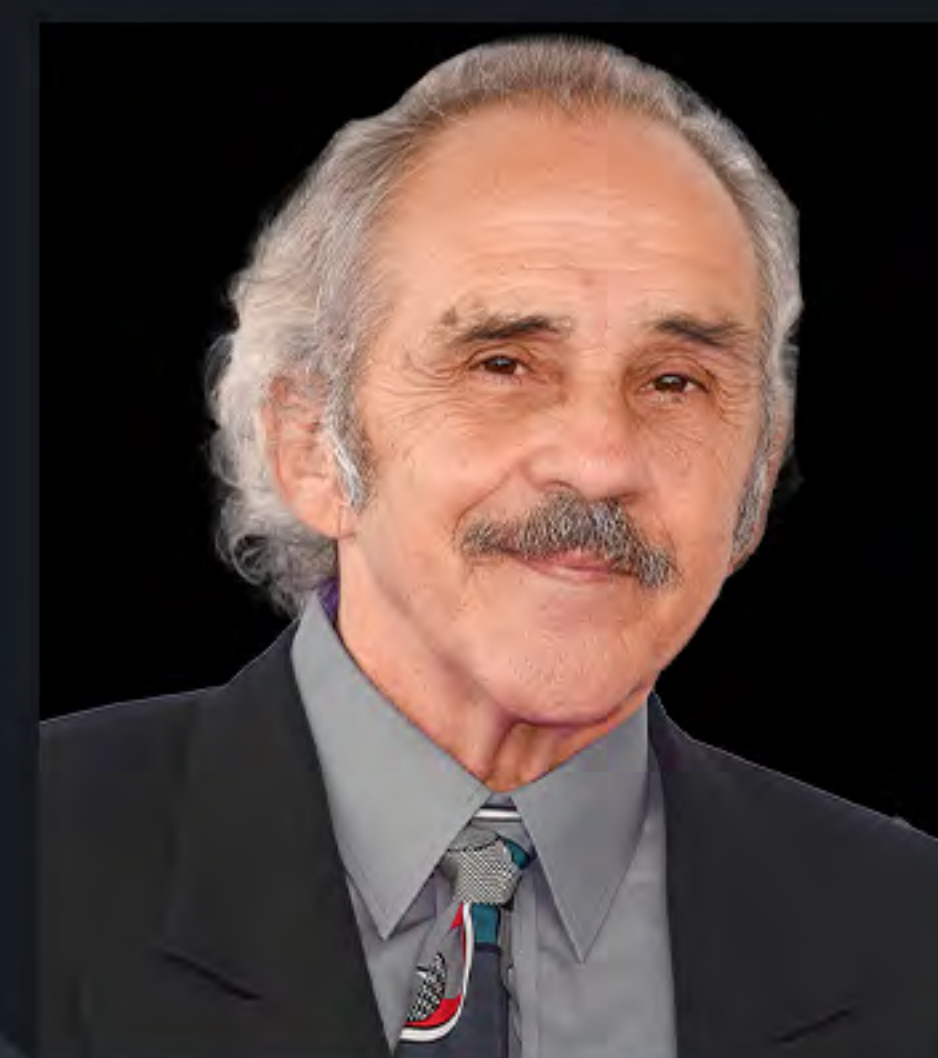

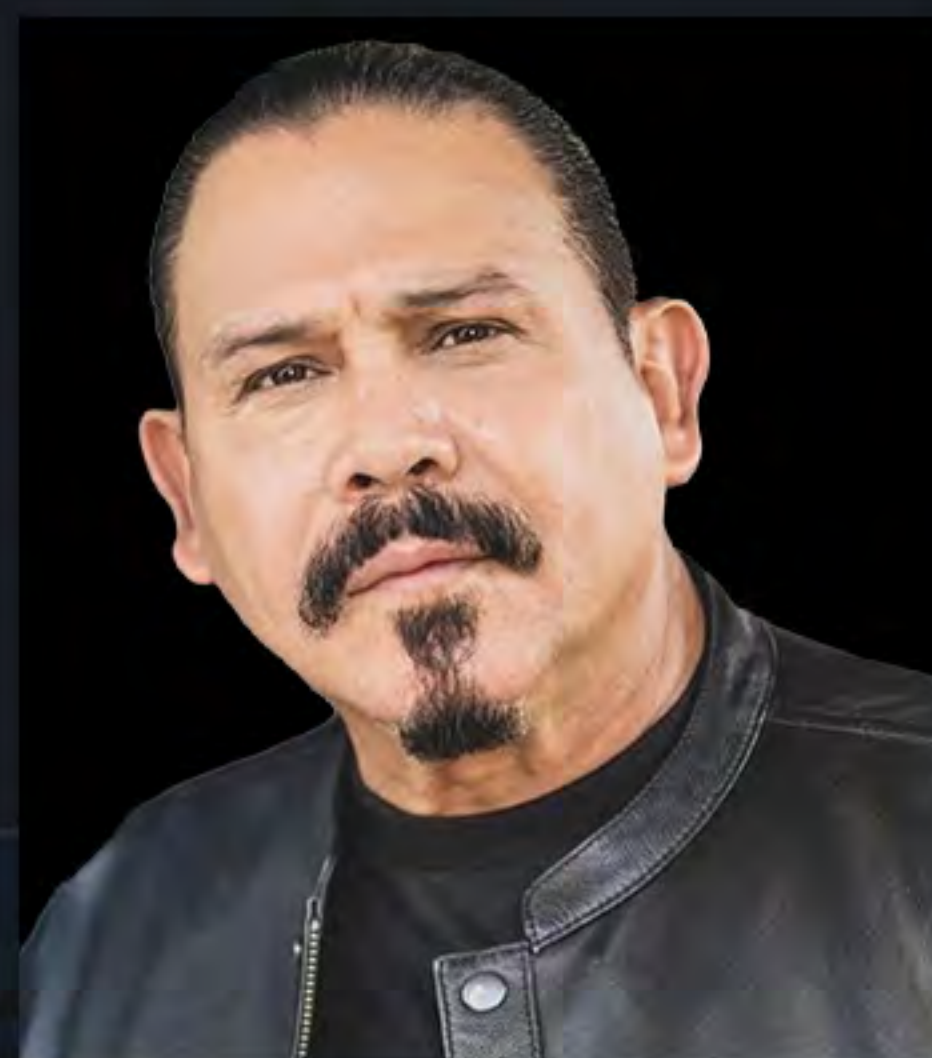
